

Instructions for using the Justice for J6 Candidate's Pledge

This pledge was created for the use of regular citizens to use as a way to engage our elected officials on the facts of the January 6 false flag event, and the political persecution of Americans as a result of that event.

It was written by Suzzanne Monk, for the use of the entire patriot community. There is no specific organization or groups sponsoring this pledge. It is a pledge for INDIVIDUALS to use to get a person to person, representative to constituent promise from your elected officials and candidates that they will use their position to seek justice for the J6. You are asking them to promise YOU, or at least start a conversation about J6 and the weaponization of the government, and seek to know the truth.

So here are the basic steps to take to use the Justice for J6 Candidate's Pledge. Thank you for standing up for the J6ers and for all Americans who believe in justice for all.

1. Print out the candidate's pledge. On the bottom of the pledge, hand write your name and email address (and if you want to, your phone number). This is a pledge they are making to you, so if they are unwilling to sign immediately, you can leave it with them and they can return it to you via email, or respond to your request in the future.
2. Take the pledge to events where candidates or representatives are attending. Be bold and respectful when approaching them.
3. Show them the pledge. Tell them, "This is a pledge created by the January 6th community to raise awareness about the plight of the J6 political prisoners. This is a promise I am asking you to make to me, personally, as an American and a constituent. Will you promise me to use your office to fight for justice for the J6ers, and are you willing to pledge that to me by signing the Justice for J6 Pledge?"
4. If they sign, fantastic. Thank them, and let them know that you appreciate having an ally for justice in office. If they choose not to sign in the moment, say, "I would like to leave this pledge with you, as an opportunity for conversation on how we can get justice for these Americans being persecuted. My contact information is on the bottom of the pledge, and I would like to hear from you on what you are willing to do to help the January 6th defendants and their families. Thank you for your time and attention to this." Leave them the pledge.
5. Share the signed pledge on social media, and send it to us, at suzzannemonk@gmail.com so we too can share it.
6. If you desire to continue the conversation with your representative, send them an email within a few days of the event, thanking them for their time talking to you, and asking them to discuss what they are doing to address the horrific government abuses and disinformation surrounding the January 6th event. Start a conversation. Educate yourself about J6 at sites like www.stophate.com so that you can educate your representatives.
